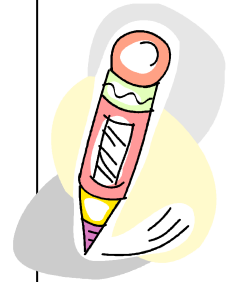


## Literacy Activities

  - Sing some farmyard songs - Old MacDonald, Five Little Ducks, Baa Baa Black Sheep.

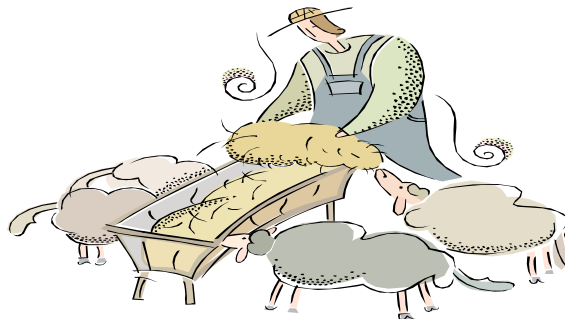


### Ladybirds Home Learning 'Down on the Farm'



## Maths Activities

- Check that I recognise number 1-10 and 11-20, in and out of sequence.
- Help me to practise writing numbers correctly (1-20).
- Talk about farm animals and their similarities and differences. Give me some problems to solve eg:
  - How many legs does a chicken/sheep have?
  - If a chicken and a sheep were in the pen, how many legs would there be altogether?
  - How many legs does a cow have? How many legs would there be if there were 2 cows?
- When I am cooking at home or helping to prepare for dinner, talk to me about doubling, halving and sharing.

- Make a 3 Dimensional farm animal using junk!  
Paint my animal/stick materials to my animal.
- OR
- Create a farmyard picture using cutting and sticking/collage materials/paints.
