Sport Allocation and Spending Statement – Period 2015 to 2017

Allocated Funds: £8850

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education investment in UK schools. The purpose of this investment is to improve the quality of sport provision and provide children with greater opportunities to engage and compete in sporting activities.

Funding has been allocated to all maintained and state-funded primary schools. Each school will annually receive an £8000 sum in addition to a further £5 per pupil. Schools are free to decide how best this money is spent to improve the quality and breadth of the PE and Games curriculum to encourage children to develop healthy lifestyles and actively partake in a wide range of sports.

The funding is only to be spent on provision of PE and sports in school.

How do we promote positive attitudes towards Physical Education and Healthy Living at Oakfield Primary School?

We believe that it is vital to instil a lifelong passion and understanding of exercise, health and nutrition within the children at our school and we aim to provide children with a wealth of experiences and opportunities in this area. Below are some of the ways in which we as a school have attempted to foster positive attitudes towards PE and healthy living.

- Entering Rock Challenge Dance Competition
- Running a wide range of clubs which include football, netball, rounders, cross country, cricket, circuit training and tag rugby.
- All children have at least 2 hours of timetabled PE a week
- Annual competitive sports day
- Annual school football tournament.
- Gifted and talented events offered through link with New Forest Schools Sports Partnership.
- Theme Days eg. Fun Runs
- Totton College come in to work directly in PE lessons with their PE students
- Health Education in PHSE and Science
- Promoting sporting events such as the FIFA World Cup, The Olympic Games and Wimbledon.
- Guest speakers from a professional sporting background such as Beth Storry (Team GB Hockey player)
- Healthcare visitors visit Year R as part of their learning about the local community.
- Promoting the drinking of water as a healthy alternative to sugary drinks.

- Healthy snacks at break time and lunch time including fruit and vegetables.
- School Council involvement with healthy tuck shops
- School Council lunch with Hampshire School Caterers to discuss healthy options at lunch times.
- Pedometer Challenge in association with ASDA Totton to promote walking.

We will sustain this approach to PE, Sport and Healthy Living by:

- Continued links with Testwood Sports College and The New Forest Schools Sports Partnership.
- Teachers continuing to work alongside specialist coaches
- Working to increase further competitive sport
- Continued professional development for teachers and PE coordinator.
- Training new staff as they join the school in the Real PE approach
- Continuing to offer the wide variety of after school sports clubs on offer
- Continuing to promote a healthy lifestyle through PSHE and Science lessons and whole school assemblies.
- Developing our approach to inter-house sporting competitions within the school.

Sports Funding at Oakfield Primary School

For the academic year 2015/16, Oakfield Primary School has received £8850. This money will be spent in the following ways:

- Employing specialist sports coaches.
- Transport to competitions and events.
- Continued professional development and training for staff and further costs associated with this.
- High quality equipment and resources.
- Membership to local sports partnerships.

How has this money been spent?

Funding for Financial Year 2015-16

During this academic year the Sports Premium money has been spent on:

- Purchasing sport equipment such as new gymnastics mats, netball bibs, competition t-shirts, message cubes and a selection of balls. (£2190)
- Membership to the New Forest Schools Sports Partnership, offering subject leader support and training on Real PE programme. (£2420)
- Additional training from the New Forest Schools Partnership for extra members of staff (£890)
- Travel associated with sporting competitions etc. (£1150).
- Swimming lessons for the current Year 4 class and some children from Year 5. (£650)

- Supply teacher costs to allow teachers to attend professional development in PE and sport (£1200)
- LSA training and support associated with sporting competitions etc. (£250)
- Year 3 and 6 took part in the 'Chance to Shine' cricket coaching programme run by Hampshire Cricket. (£100)

Total: £8850

Funding for Financial Year 2016-17

So far this academic year Oakfield Primary School has received £3637 (instalment 1) towards continuing provision for PE and Sports.

During this academic year the Sports Premium money has been spent on:

- Membership to the New Forest Schools Sports Partnership, offering subject leader support and training on Real PE programme. (£2420)
- Additional training from the New Forest Schools Partnership for extra members of staff (£299)
- Purchasing sport equipment to accompany the Real PE package. (£270)
- Purchasing games and equipment to develop fine and gross motor skill development in Early Years and KS1. (£65)
- Pedal Power Scooter training for children in Years R – 3. (£300)
- Supply teacher costs to allow teachers to attend professional development in PE and sport (£283)
